Follow-up activity

Organise students into groups. Get them to play *Report the question*. One student asks a question using the present tense. The next student reports it and adds another question. The next student reports that and so on.

Student 1: Do you ever miss lessons?Student 2: He asked him if he ever missed lessons. Where do you live?Student 3: He asked him where he lived. What is a uniform?Student 1: He asked what a uniform was. Why is English so important?Student 2: He asked him why English was so important. Can you swim?
