Phonics practice activity

Ask the children to repeat: *Perfect weather for the beach! Take some bread and a peach, don't take a sweater, take a hat for your head!*

Follow-up activity

Elicit and write on the board five or six sentences from the writing task on page 33 of the Language Book. Have all the children repeat the sentences after you. Then erase one or two words from each sentence and have the children read out the sentences again, including the missing words. Then erase even more words, so each sentence has only one or two key words. Ask the children to remember and say the whole text.
