

AS ... AS / SO ...AS

 We use as + adjective + as in affirmative sentences to say that things are equal.

Example: Mary runs as fast as Mary.



- In a negative sentences, we can use
- as + adjective + as or so + adjective + as to say things are not equal Example: She cannot go as far as / so far as the others.



+ ER THAN / MORE ... THAN

- Example: Mary is taller than Ann. A) Short adjectives (1 or 2 syllables) + er + than
- B) More + long adjective + than

Example: She is more intelligent than Susan

- Adjectives ending in -y change the -y to -i + er Example: Mark is heavier than John.
- When the adjective ends in a vowel + consonant, the consonant at the end is doubled

Example: $big \rightarrow bigger$

SOME ADJECTIVES HAVE IRREGULAR FORMS $good \rightarrow better \quad bad \rightarrow worse$
