## Imperative - Classroom instructions The Imperative can be used in different situations: In the IMPERATIVE the person is not usually

- To give orders. E.g.: Sit down!
- To give instructions. E.g.: Push the red button and wait three seconds.
- To ask someone to do or not to do something. E.g.: Please, close the door.
- To make suggestions. E.g.: Let's go to the cinema. (Let's = Let us)

- In the negative form we **put don't before the** main verb.

E.g.: **Don't** open the window.

- Let's is always followed by the infinitive. E.g.: Let's play.
- We can make the imperative 'more polite' by adding do. E.g.: **Do** be quiet.
