#### Follow-up activity

Ask the children to look at pages 6 and 7 of their Language Book and ask the class a few example questions about the picture: e.g. *How much ice cream is there? (Not much.) How many fish are there? (Lots of fish.)*. Remind the children that their answers can be a number or *A lot.../ Lots of..* or *Not much/many*. Give them a minute to look at the pictures, then they continue asking and answering questions in pairs.
